Scholarships of 10 to 30 percent are available for SBNM graduate students who have an undergraduate or graduate degree GPA of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale. Scholarships of 35% are also available for SBNM graduate students who are full time employees of all nonprofit, governmental, and military organizations as well as former members of the Peace Corps, AmeriCorps, and Teach for America. Individuals who volunteer 27 or more hours a week at any of the organizations listed above are also eligible.

Graduates from any graduate degree program in the School of Business and Nonprofit Management are eligible to take courses at a 50% tuition reduction for the rest of their life, including courses leading to a second graduate degree.
