Additional comments regarding the North Park Dialogue

- Transfer students are placed in the Dialogue courses according to the total amount of credit transferred in to North Park. Please refer to the following placement chart:

Total credits transferred	Required Dialogue Courses
< 30	NPD 1000, 2000, 3000
$30 \leq 60$	NPD 2000, 3000
$60 \leq 90$	NPD 3000
≥ 90	Exempt

- If a traditional undergraduate transfer student has not completed an English writing course prior to enrolling at North Park University the Office of Student Enrichment Services and Support (OSESS) will assess the student's writing level through the ACT/SAT subscore in writing, personal statement, etc. Those students needing remedial writing instruction will be required to register for the appropriate classes. Contact OSESS for more details.
- Transfer students with 60 credits or more, and who have not completed a philosophy course will need to take a philosophy course at North Park. Contact OSESS for more details.
- Credit completed at North Park does not affect your Dialogue placement. If you have questions about transfer credit and the North Park Dialogue courses, please contact OSESS.
