About Sweden and Jönköping

- Jönköping lies at the southern end of Lake Vättern in one of Sweden's most economically prosperous regions. The municipality has a population of 125,100. Vättern is Sweden's second largest, and Europe's fifth largest, lake. The lake is known for its clear and cold waters and is a catchment area for drinking water, supplying some 250,000 people.
- Stockholm, Göteborg, Malmö and Copenhagen are all easily accessible in a few hours by car, bus, train or plane from Jönköping.
- Annual attractions and events include the Jönköping Film Festival, the traditional Market Day, Children's Culture Days and the Dance Festival. Jönköping also offers a wide selection of music performances given by both amateurs and professionals, often at the Jönköping Concert Hall. There are also a number of theatrical societies and stages, some 15 libraries, and 120 cultural societies.
- Jönköping is a logistics hub for the whole of south Sweden, and historically a centre for trade and commerce. This tradition is now carried on by the Elmia Exhibition Centre, today one of the most important venues for national and international conferences, events, and trade fairs.
- Jönköping has one of Sweden's largest swimming baths and fitness centers—the Rosenlundsbadet Centre—which has, in addition to the outdoor pools, two indoor facilities for swimming and other fitness activities.
