SEARCH FOR CLASSES

You may search for classes using North Park's WebAdvisor. WebAdvisor will display only the courses offered during one semester. The catalog (www.northpark.edu/catalog) will describe all courses offered by the University.

As a new student you can only search for classes and available sections. You will not be able to register through WebAdvisor.

To search for classes:

- Visit www.northpark.edu
- Click on the "Current Students" link.
- On the "Current Students" menu, under the heading "Student Resources," click on the link to WebAdvisor.
- Once on the WebAdvisor home page, click on the blue banner labeled "Students"
- Proceed to "Search for Sections." Select the "Term" for which you are attending North Park (10/S1 - Fall 10/11) (10/S2 - Spring 10/11)
- Select the "Subject" that you wish to find a class for (Example: BTS Biblical and Theological Studies or COMM Communication Studies)
- Click on "Submit" and you will see all of the classes that are offered under this particular department for the semester
- Make note of the courses that you are interested in and fill in the required information on the Course Preference Form
