For more information on studying abroad through North Park University, please do the following:

1. Read through the Study Abroad Handbook to learn how studying abroad works at North Park. You can download it from www.northpark.edu/studyabroad or pick up a copy at the International Office on the first floor of Magnuson Campus Center.
2. Meet with your academic advisor to determine how and when studying abroad can best fit into your schedule.
3. Make an appointment with the Director of the International Office to find out more about the programs listed above, or other programs that may fit your academic needs or personal interests.
4. Leave plenty of time to complete a quality application to the North Park Study Abroad Program. You can download an application from www.northpark.edu/studyaroad or pick up a copy at the International Office on the first floor of Magnuson Campus Center. Remember:
 - a. Any North Park student who wishes to study abroad must *first* be accepted as a Study Abroad Candidate. North Park study abroad applications are due the January before the academic year in which you hope to study abroad.
 - b. Secondary applications to specific study abroad programs (ISEP, bilateral exchange partners, CCCU, etc.) have different due dates. Acceptance as a North Park study abroad candidate does not guarantee acceptance into a particular study abroad program.
