HSTY 7300 COVENANT HISTORY AND THEOLOGY

Philip J. Anderson, Professor

Spring Semester 2010

The purpose of this introductory course is to assist the student in gaining a deeper knowledge of and appreciation for the history of the Evangelical Covenant Church. This includes background in the Lutheran reformation tradition of Sweden and Europe as well as the "free church" movements that influenced the revivals of the nineteenth century. The transplantation of the Swedish renewal to America by Swedish immigrants provides the immediate context of the denomination's history. The course will also examine the theological roots of the Covenant's tradition and explore the meanings of that heritage for today.

The normal format will be lecture and discussion. Students are encouraged to raise pertinent questions in class arising from the lectures and readings. The primary emphases in the course are basic mastery of the assigned texts, the opportunity to research some facet of Covenant history in depth, and the ability to discern and articulate in constructive ways the relevance of the historical issues for the life of the church. There will also be opportunity to participate in a group presentation on an important issue in Covenant life.

Please note: HSTY5200 and HSTY5201 are prerequisites for admission to this course, unless permission is granted by the instructor.

Two major bibliographies will be posted on Blackboard: a general bibliography of Covenant history and theology; and a bibliography of articles in the *Covenant Quarterly* pertaining to the Covenant's life and thought.

Written Assignments:

1. **Reflection Paper** on the theme: "My Perceptions of the Covenant Church." Here the student is offered early in the term the opportunity to reflect on his/her pilgrimage in the church, how one came to know the Covenant Church, and what the "essence" of the denomination is understood to be. **This 3-4 page paper is due no later than February 9.**

2. **Research Paper** on some aspect of Covenant history and theology. Special emphasis will be given to the ECC's oral history projects, if interested. The student should consult with the professor concerning the topic and preliminary resources. **Written topic proposals are due no later than February 18.** The paper is to be approximately fifteen (15) pages, typed double-spaced (250 words per page, 12 point, 1" margins), fully annotated with bibliography, and is **due no later than April 29.** NPTS policy regarding plagiarism and intellectual integrity will be observed.

3. **An in-class midterm examination** will be given **March 18.**

4. **A final examination** will be given **May 6 or 7.**

Each member of the class will be involved in one of five group presentations. All are expected equally to be involved in and committed to the time and work necessary to prepare for the presentation.
