

**North Park Seminary Hosts Fuller Seminary Doctor of Ministry Seminar**  
***The People of God in Worship: Contextual Theology in Action***  
**August 2-6, 2010**

Former NPTS professor Todd Johnson, a Covenant pastor currently teaching at Fuller Seminary in southern California, will return to Chicago in August as Fuller offers a course to be held in the North Park Seminary building. The course will explore the theory and practice of Christian worship in a culture which puts multiple pressures and expectations on worship. It will examine various expressions of Christian worship and their theological meaning. A multi-layered congregational study of an actual church's life and worship will be available on an interactive DVD-ROM.
