Nursing Prerequisites and Supporting Courses

Acceptance to North Park University and/or completion of the application requirements does not guarantee acceptance into the nursing major

Requirements:

- Completion of all prerequisite courses with a grade of C or higher; a grade of C- is not acceptable.
- No more than two (2) prerequisite courses may be repeated, only one (1) of which may be a science course.
- Successful Completion of the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) test given by the School of Nursing prior to admission into the program. This is a standardized test from Assessment Technologies Institute (www.atitesting.com) and must be completed at North Park University.
- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.
- Letter of recommendation which directly speaks to the student's suitability to the profession.
- Completed formal application to the major. (Application is completed with the student's prenursing advisor)

Successful completion of a comprehensive exam is required for graduation.
