Major Requirements:

Required Semester Hours: 36 semester hours

Required Core Courses: 20 semester hours

- HIST 2120: United States since 1877 (4)
- HIST 4010: Capstone Seminar (4)

Additional Graduation Requirements

- Total of 120 semester hours, minimum. Additional courses may need to be taken to meet this requirement.
- Grade Point Average
 - Overall cumulative grade point average of 2.00
 - Cumulative grade point average in major of 2.00
- Last 30 semester hours must be taken at North Park
- Acceptance into the major

Major Requirements cont.:

Three courses from the following:

- HIST 2110: United States to 1877 (4)
- HIST 2230: The Mediterranean World (4)
- HIST 2240: The Eurasian World (4)
- HIST 2250: The Atlantic World (4)
- HIST 2260: The Modern World (4)

Elective Courses: 16 semester hours, all courses are to be at the 3000+ level and chosen from the following areas:

- Africa
- Ancient and Medieval
- Middle East
- Modern Europe
- United States

Students may distribute elective courses either generally or in a regional concentration.

Students must take at least one course from the Social Sciences and one course from each of the Humanities Department. Students are encouraged to consult their advisor for suggestions about particular courses. Students with a double major or those obtaining a secondary teaching certificate are exempt from the Humanities requirement.

- Sociology, Politics & Government (Social Science)
- Art (Humanities) (may be met by a course selected to meet the GE Fine Arts requirement)
- English (Humanities) (may be met by a course selected to meet the GE Fine Arts requirement)
- Philosophy (Humanities)

Students who choose a regional concentration will take two History seminars in that area, their Social Science elective and one of their Humanities electives in that area, and at least two History seminars from at least one other area.

Presentation of the senior seminar research at a History Department conference and presentation of a major portfolio are required for graduation.
