 - Completion of all prerequisite courses with a grade of C or higher. A C- is not acceptable.
 - No more than two (2) prerequisite courses may be repeated, only one (1) of which may be a science course.
 - Successful completion of the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) test given by the School of Nursing prior to admission. This is standardized test from Assessment Technologies Institute.
 - GPA of 2.75 or higher

- Total of 120 semester hours, minimum. Additional courses may need to be taken to meet this requirement.
- Grade Point Average
 - Overall cumulative grade point average of 2.00, plus a minimum of a "C" in each of the nursing courses.
 - Cumulative grade point average in major of 2.00
- Last 30 semester hours must be taken at North Park
- Acceptance into the major. A student must have a grade point average of 2.75 to enter the Nursing program, successfully complete the entire prerequisite Nursing courses with a minimum grade of "C" and successfully pass an entrance exam and application process.
