Homeschooled Students

North Park University welcomes homeschooled students and the application requirements are the same as for other students. Under the section of the application where you list high schools attended, write homeschooled, in addition to any formal high schools you have attended. In addition to a transcript, a letter to the admission office helping us understand your homeschooling experience is recommended.

Transfer Applicants

- Correctly complete all required information on the application.
- Pay non-refundable application fee: \$40
- Request that official college transcripts be submitted directly to North Park University

Transfer students with more than 12 hours of transferable credit do not need to submit a high-school transcript unless requested by the Office of Undergraduate Admission or if college courses taken during high school were applied to meet high-school graduation requirements. Students with fewer than 12 hours of transferable college credits will be considered first-year students and should follow those instructions.

- Send final transcript upon end of studies at previous institution.

Second Degree-Seeking Students

Students who have already earned a bachelor's degree, including a previous degree from North Park University, may apply for the purpose of earning a second bachelor's degree. Students should submit the undergraduate application to the Office of Admission, arrange for submission of transcripts showing all previous college or graduate work.

Non-Degree-Seeking/Visiting Students/Audit

Non-degree-seeking students studying during the regular academic year (Fall – Spring) must complete the first page of the regular application and sign the final page. May take up to 30 credit hours. Submit to the Office of Undergraduate Admission, along with a \$200 tuition deposit.

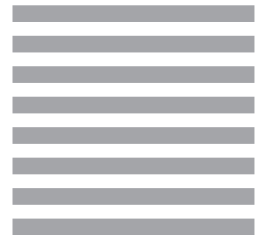
