Ordained to Word and Sacrament in the Evangelical Church, Jolene Bergstrom Carlson's life passion is a desire to experience and live out Micah 6:8: "This is what Yahweh asks of you: only this, to act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God."

Carlson began her professional journey teaching communication and theatre at community colleges in the 1960s, where she supported the development of racial reconciliation programming and materials. While raising her children, she became a parent educator, developing resources and training leaders to facilitate church, school, and community support groups.

A former pastor told her, "You are a pastor and won't be at peace until you go to seminary." This calling became apparent in midlife, so Carlson went even though few women were in pastoral leadership at the time. She studied at North Park Theological Seminary, Bethany Seminary, and the Lutheran School of Theology.

After seminary, Carlson served 10 years as senior pastor at Douglas Park Covenant Church, a small church in an immigrant community near the Cook County Department of Corrections. This position challenged her to grow in ways of justice and love beyond herself. She went on to serve as associate pastor at North Park Covenant Church and then in middle judicatory leadership as associate superintendent of the Central Conference for a decade, where she facilitated new church development. During this time, she received spiritual director training.

Carlson then became the executive director of Ministry Mentors, a national nonprofit that facilitated and trained pastors in peer mentoring and connected them with seminary students. Most recently, she served as interim pastor at Resurrection Covenant Church. In retirement, Carlson continues to serve where she believes she's meant to be.

She was married to the late Rev. Dr. Richard W. Carlson, former seminary professor, and has three adult children and six grandchildren.

A NOTE REGARDING ACADEMIC REGALIA

Today's academic attire is a legacy of the Middle Ages. While defining status, they kept wearers warm in the period's drafty and unheated stone buildings. In modern times, the attire is no longer protective, but is still worn to signify the wearer's degree.

Unadorned bachelor's gowns are the simplest in design, master's gowns have half-sleeves, and doctoral gowns are distinguishable by their velvet facing and three velvet chevrons on the sleeve. The velvet may be black or reflect the color of the wearer's degree.

You will notice some faculty are more colorfully attired. These gowns have traditionally denoted degrees from European universities, where each institution prescribes its regalia. In recent years, however, American institutions have increasingly departed from black and adopted more colorful garb for doctoral degrees.

The academic hood's size and velvet trim color reflect thewearer's degree and the institution from which they earned it. At North Park, both graduates and faculty wear hoods. The degree colors commonly found at North Park are:

Apricot Nursing

Some graduates also have gold cords around their necks, indicating honors. One cord indicates honors (a 3.50 cumulative grade point average on a 4.00 scale), and two denote high honors (a 3.75 cumulative grade point average on a 4.00 scale).

The medallion the university president traditionally wears contains the North Park University seal, the symbol of the presidential office. The Celtic cross the seminary dean wears was presented to him as a symbol of his office at his installation.

The order of precedence in academic processions generally places those of the highest rank toward the rear. In processional order, the degree recipients enter first, led by the marshal, banner bearer, and crucifer. They are followed in order by faculty, administrators, board members, and the platform party. The opposite order prevails for the recessional.

These centuries-old customs, reflected in today's ceremonies, remind us that while Commencement points to the future, that which is now commencing is also a culmination. Our resources for dealing with either the present or future are necessarily drawn from the accumulated store of wisdom that belongs to the ages and is discovered and reworked anew by each generation.
