### **Core Curriculum**

The mission of the Department of Biblical and Theological Studies within the Core Curriculum is to enable students to fashion lives of significance and service by providing them with opportunities to develop intellectually, spiritually, and socially through their experience in a biblical and theological program. Such an experience occurs in the contexts of (1) an international student body and Faculty, (2) a culturally diverse urban setting, (3) a vibrant dialogue about Christianity, faith, and culture, and (4) a school committed to a broad evangelical Christian tradition.

### **Major**

The Biblical and Theological Studies major equips students with a deep and enduring Christian faith, exploring the intersection of faith and work, and of calling and career, in an ever-changing world. Students will gain foundational knowledge in biblical and theological studies, reflecting on the life of Jesus Christ, the redemptive narrative of Christian Scripture, and the broader Christian tradition to develop clarity about their sense of purpose for advancing human flourishing globally.

Through cooperative partnerships and courses in related disciplines, students will be encouraged to experience various career paths, including church and parachurch ministry, civic service, social justice, and works of compassion and mercy. Internships and other potential initiatives provide students with practical application of their theological and ethical learning.

Additionally, the major complements a wide range of academic fields and serves as an excellent second major for students pursuing careers in education, social work, business, healthcare, public policy, and other professions where Christian faith informs vocation. Students seeking to integrate their careers with a robust Christian identity will find this major especially beneficial.

The major's five outcomes are:

1. *Biblical and theological intelligence*: Students will articulate the broad narratives of Christian Scripture, history, and theology.
2. *Biblical and theological fluency*: Students will apply biblical and theological resources to engage critically with their own lives and contemporary culture.
3. *Intercultural engagement*: Students will negotiate the twenty-first-century pluralistic society with Christian hospitality, empathy, forgiveness, and reconciliation.
4. *Ecclesial and community priority*: Students will foster communities of faith in everyday life, animated by a commitment to the Gospel, seeking to become people for others.
5. *Vocation and identity*: Students will discern their unique divine calling and explore various career paths.

## **BA in Biblical and Theological Studies**

### **Major requirements**
