

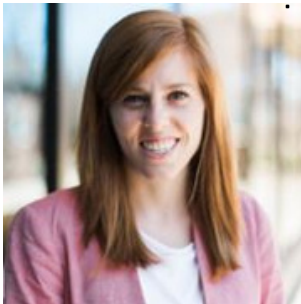


Welcome to North Park University! We are so excited you're here. In this letter, you'll find lots of helpful information for your first days and weeks on campus.

- **Campus Map:** Use the map to locate the different buildings you will need to go to during orientation.

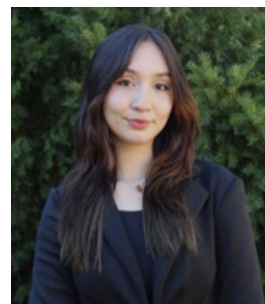
The best way to reach the Office of International Affairs is to send us an email or visit us in Sohlberg Hall (First floor).
