Course Description: This intensive course is a seminar-styled course which will take place from Thursday evening through Saturday evening. This course fulfills *part* of the requirement of the ECC for ordination as well as helps graduating students grow in their vocational identity, prepare for being in the Call Process and transition from seminary student to ministry leader. In addition, students explore how the Evangelical Covenant Church pursues Christ's priorities in the world by covenanting congregationally, regionally, denominationally and globally.

*Note: Spouses are invited and encouraged to attend as much of the class as possible except Friday morning October 27, 2017 at ECC offices.

Course Learning Objectives:

By the end of this course students will be able to:

- 1. Complete a CovConnect Minister's Profile in preparation for the Call to Ministry process.
- 2. Communicate the necessary techniques and skills necessary to be prepared for the Call to Ministry Process including interviewing and candidating.
- 3. Articulate one's call to ministry in preparation for interviews with superintendents and churches.
- 4. Implement the necessary strategies to manage clergy financial issues and solutions and begin to develop a personal and ministry budget in preparation for being a ministry professional.
- 5. Communicate the primary tenets of the ECC's Organizing for Mission strategy by being exposed to the mission and ministry of the ECC.
- 6. Articulate the polity and structure of the Evangelical Covenant Church in order to teach and practice it at the congregational level.
- 7. Access the resources and services available to ECC ministry leaders.
